1. **Community-led Projects:** recognises recent community-led built environment projects, including new buildings, historic buildings or monuments that have been reused or refurbished, designed public realm schemes such as street-works or parks, and designed landscapes such as gardens or public green spaces.
2. **Community Champions:** celebrates individuals in communities across Scotland who have made a significant contribution to their local area through achieving positive change in the built environment, whether through built heritage, public spaces or access to these by communities.

Winners of the Awards are celebrated at a ceremony attended by major stakeholders in the built environment and heritage sectors, as well as representatives from local and national government.

Many will be aware of a significant increase in the amount of HGV traffic on Peel Road which appears to be heading to the new housing development at Jackton. The road is not suited to a large volume of heavy vehicles. There was a similar problem with an earlier Jackton development. At that time SatNav may have been showing Peel Road as the most direct route.
