Matters Arising

HGV's travelling through Thorntonhall to Jackton – Councillor Watson will raise at SLC and liaise with the developers on possible alternate routes. Also consider possible weight restriction signage. Linked to this is the earlier suggestion to reduce the speed limit on Peel Road, Thorntonhall to 20mph. In regard to this, because Peel Rd is the main road through the village it is unlikely that the speed limit will be reduced. New automatic speed registering signs have been erected on both ends of the village. Hopefully this will encourage drivers to slow down.

Flooding and Raw sewage on Eaglesham Road, Jackton

Scottish Water have advised that their local Network Analyst has arranged for another CCTV survey of the sewers as a precautionary measure. They will be in touch with further information in due course.

Boulder in the verge on Braehead Road - Located on the left-hand side, going uphill and before junction with Thornton Road. A car recently sustained significant wheel damage hitting the boulder in the verge when pulling in to allow a larger vehicle to pass. Apparently, this is not the first time this has happened. Councillor Watson will raise with Roads Department.

Chair's Report – Claire Marr

Summary of recent Webinar talk introducing the role of 'The National Centre for Resilience to Natural Hazards' which is based at Glasgow University. They have launched a new fund for 2024/2025, offering £500 grants to Community Councils for local resilience plans and projects. An example of a local project is a resilience directory of contact names and numbers that could be used by emergency services. Another example is special first aid training. Deadline for applications is 24th January. The Committee will research the feasibility of a plan and application for a grant.
