<b>Children and Young People's Mental Health Awareness</b>	
<b>Course Outline</b>	<p>This workshop can be delivered to children, young people, staff, volunteers, parents and carers and provides a grounding in mental health awareness.</p> <p>It defines mental health and wellbeing and explores the most common mental health problems affecting children and young people.</p> <p>The workshop engages learners to explore their understanding of mental health stigma and discrimination, how they can look after their own mental health, as well as support others.</p>
<b>Aims &amp; Objectives</b>	<p>By the end of the workshop learners will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have an understanding of mental health and wellbeing</li> <li>• Be able to name the most common mental health problems affecting children and young people &amp; to have an awareness of their characteristics</li> <li>• Have an understanding of mental health stigma and discrimination, and its impact</li> <li>• Have an understanding of how, where and when to seek help around mental health</li> <li>• Have learned about and experienced useful mindfulness exercises.</li> </ul>
<b>Duration</b>	90mins (1 x 90 min or 2 x 45 min sessions)
<b>Attendees</b>	Up to 16 – online (staff or parents/carers online only) Up to 1 full class or if staff/parent group up to 16 - face to face

<b>Understanding and Managing Stress and Anxiety</b>	
<b>Course Outline</b>	<p>This workshop can be delivered to children, young people, staff, volunteers, parents and carers and provides them with an awareness of stress and anxiety.</p> <p>It encourages learners to consider the pressure and stress that we all experience, and how these can sometimes develop into anxiety. Learners are introduced to coping strategies, breathing and grounding activities.</p>
<b>Aims &amp; Objectives</b>	<p>By the end of the workshop learners will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have an understanding of worry, stress and anxiety</li> <li>• Be able to recognise the <i>Fight, Flight, Freeze</i> stress response</li> <li>• Have an understanding of how, where and when to seek help for anxiety</li> <li>• Have learned new ways to feel calmer through breathing and mindfulness exercises</li> </ul>

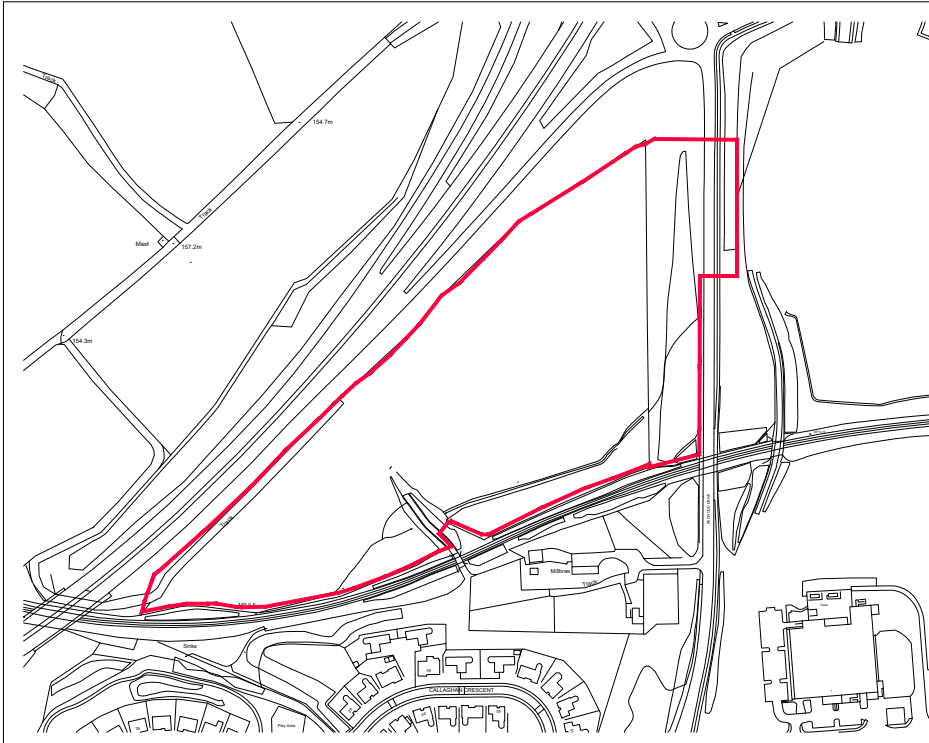
