For the introduction of a taxis rank

Location: Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, East Kilbride

Proposal: Introduction of a taxi rank

1. Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, East Kilbride is located to the west of East Kilbride Town centre and is situated off Redwood Drive.
2. Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park is a new car park and therefore there are no existing restrictions.
3. There will be a taxi rank within the new Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, and to prevent other vehicles parking within the taxi rank we need to regulate the taxi rank.
4. It is therefore proposed to regulate the taxi rank within the new Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, East Kilbride to prevent all vehicles, except taxis parking within the designated taxi bays.
5. The Chief Constable, Strathclyde Partnership for Transport and the Local Members have been consulted and have no objections to the proposals.
6. It is recommended, therefore that South Lanarkshire Council advertises its intention to make a Traffic Regulation Order introducing a taxi rank within Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, East Kilbride

Preliminary Report

For the introduction of a regulated car park

Location: Bus access road within Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, East Kilbride

Proposal: Introduction of a no entry except service buses and an electric service bus charging bay

1. The Bus access road within Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, East Kilbride is situated to the west of East Kilbride town centre and is accessed off Redwood Drive.
2. Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park is currently under construction and therefore there are no existing restrictions within the bus access road within Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park.
3. The new Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park has an access road for service buses, which requires to be regulated with a no entry restriction. This restriction will prevent all other vehicles from accessing the road.

An electric service bus charging bay has been placed within the Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park Bus Access Road to facilitate the provision of electric service bus charging.

4. It is proposed to prohibit entry to all vehicles, except service buses, from Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park Access Road to Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park Bus Access Road, East Kilbride.

It is proposed to restrict a short section of road, within the Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park Bus Access Road, to be used by electric service buses charging within the parking bays.

5. The Chief Constable, Strathclyde Partnership for Transport and the Local Members have been consulted and have no objections to the proposals.
6. It is recommended, therefore that South Lanarkshire Council advertises its intention to make a Traffic Regulation Order introducing a no entry restriction and electric service bus charging bay, on the bus access road within Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, East Kilbride.

For the introduction of a regulated car park

Location: Hairmyres park and ride North car park, East Kilbride
Hairmyres park and ride South car park, East Kilbride

Proposal: Introduction of a regulated car park

1. The new Hairmyres Park and Ride North and South car parks, East Kilbride are situated to the west of East Kilbride town centre and are accessed off Redwood Drive.
2. Hairmyres Park and Ride North and South car parks are currently under construction and therefore there are no existing restrictions.
3. Due to the relocation of the Hairmyres station, there will be 2 new car parks, which will be known as the Hairmyres Park and Ride North car park and the Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park. Both car parks require to be regulated to ensure enforcement within the car parks.
4. It is therefore proposed to regulate Hairmyres Park and Ride North car park and the Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park where there will be restrictions within the disabled bays and the electric vehicle charging bays. There will also be bays marked for the exclusive use of Scotrail vehicles.

Vehicles parking outwith marked bays will be prohibited.

5. The Chief Constable, Strathclyde Partnership for Transport and the Local Members have been consulted and have no objections to the proposals.
6. It is recommended, therefore that South Lanarkshire Council advertises its intention to make a Traffic Regulation Order introducing restrictions within the Hairmyres Park and Ride North car park and the Hairmyres Park and Ride South car park, both East Kilbride.
